



Health IT Outcomes

Reduced Medical Error: E-prescriptions are clear in terms of treatment and dosage and require less interpretation on the part of the pharmacist. This can <u>reduce prescription and medication errors</u>.

Prescription Fulfillment Tracking: E-prescription systems can help doctors track whether or not patients have picked up the next refill.

Increased Efficiency: Clinicians can automatically refill dozens of RXs at the same time, increasing efficiency and reducing prescription error rate.

Reduced Readmissions: Access to clinical decision support about a patient's allergies and drug history, e-prescription systems can reduce errors. Of the 1.6 million hospital readmissions annually, <u>13 percent</u> of them are caused in part by adverse reactions to drugs including failure to consider potential side effects and interactions.

Cost Savings: Improved outcomes, increased efficiency and reduced patient visits — have been shown to save practices <u>between \$140 and \$240 billion</u> over the last 10 years.




How State Mandates Affect eRx Adoption

Specifics of California eRx Mandate

- Effective 1/1/22, all prescriptions for any substance must be transmitted electronically by prescriber to the pharmacy.
- Exceptions:
 - Schedule II prescription for a person with a terminal illness
 - eRx not available due to temporary technological or electric failure
 - Prescription to be filled by out of state pharmacy
 - The prescription is issued by a veterinarian.
 - The prescription is for eyeglasses or contact lenses.
 - The prescribing health care practitioner and the dispenser are the same entity.
 - Issued by a prescribing health care practitioner under circumstances whereby the practitioner reasonably
 determines that it would be impractical for the patient to obtain substances prescribed by an electronic
 data transmission prescription in a timely manner, and the delay would adversely impact the patient's
 medical condition



Specifics of California eRx Mandate

- Effective 1/1/22, all prescriptions for any substance must be transmitted electronically by prescriber to the pharmacy.
- Exceptions (cont.):
 - The prescription that is issued includes elements not covered by the latest version of the National Council for Prescription Drug Programs' SCRIPT standard, as amended from time to time.
 - The prescription is issued in a hospital emergency department or urgent care clinic and patient resides
 outside California or outside geographic area of hospital or is homeless/indigent or issued at a time when
 a patient's regular or preferred pharmacy is likely to be closed
 - Prescription issued to an inmate or person on parole



EPCS Mandated for Medicare Patients

SUPPORT Act

Provision:

Requires providers to use EPCS for all schedule II-V prescriptions for Part D or Medicare Advantage plans

Impact:

Providers with Medicare patients must be ready with and using an e-prescribing solution

Effective:

• January 1, 2021

Compliance Date:

January 1, 2022 – May be delayed until January 1, 2023

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iPrescribe Registration Steps

- 1. User downloads the application via AppStore or Google Play.
- 2. Once App is downloaded, click on "Sign Up" via homepage of iPrescribe once opened.
- 3. User is presented with Registration Form and completes all information on the form.
- 4. Once form is submitted, user will receive confirmation email and next steps on process (Explains IDP process, how to obtain credentials, how to complete LAC).
- 5. User will receive IDP invite (LOA2 or LOA3 (for EPCS) dependent on form information).
- 6. User completes IDP process (guide included in confirmation email to assist).
- 7. Once IDP process is completed, user will email iPrescribereg@drfirst.com to obtain credentials and complete EPCS enrollment.
